August 26th: Saints Elias, Jeremy and Companions

(~309) these five Egyptian Christians journeyed to the mines of Cilicia to visit their fellow Christians. As the five men were on their way back to Egypt, they were stopped by Roman guards. Upon confessing their Christian identity, they were arrested and tortured on a rack. Before being beheaded.

August 27th: St. Monica

(331-387) had a strict Christian upbringing in modern day Tunisia. Her penitential tears won the conversion of her husband, her mother-in-law, and, oh yeah, her famous son who changed the course of Western civilization! Pray at her relic shrine in Sant'Agostino of the Piazza Navona.

August 28th: St. Augustine (354-430) is the doctor of

grace- and is still the authority when the church leans towards semi-Pelagianism. I would love to see Carthage and Hippo, but till then, I pray at his relic's shrine in Pavia. We will venerate his relic at St. John's during the morning Mass this day.

August 29th: Beheading of St. John the Baptist (30+) has been the feast (since the 5th century) that has captured the imagination of painters and playwrights of every generation because it pits the prophetically righteous up against the lasciviously debauched.

August 30: St. Narcisa (1832-1869) worked as a seamstress to contribute to her family. Supported by the guidance of several spiritual directors, she resolved to consecrate herself to Christ. Narcisa was frequently seen in a state of ecstasy.

St. Pammachius (410) was a friend of St. Jerome who married St. Paula's daughter Paulina, and whose house I hope to visit in Rome – on the Coelian Hill. He founded a pilgrim's hospice in Porto.

August 31st: St. RAYMOND NONNATUS

(1204-1240) My Dad (ray Sr.) was named for this obscure saint for obvious reasons: St. Raymond was the patron saint of difficult delivery and birth and grandma was struggling to give birth to this healthy baby boy. St. Raymond's shrine is in Portello in Catalonia. He died at the age of 36 after abusive treatment as a prisoner in Algiers.

September 1st: St. Gilles (650-710) was a Greek hermit who became one of the most popular saint in the Middle Ages; he founded an abbey in Provence. His relics were restored to the abbey in the 1860's. St. Gilles is the patron saint of the physically disabled. We pray at Sant'Egidio (Gilles in Italian) Church in Trastevere when in Rome.


