From the Secretary's Desk:

The word "Bulletin" comes from a diminutive form of the Latin *bulla* meaning "decree, notice, seal, bull" by way of the Italian *bulletta*, later, *bullettino*. It is related to the similar word "bullet (ammunition)," which hails from an older Latin word meaning, "bubble" (which word is also *bulla*). How are they connected? The lead seals used to authenticate a Papal bull were little round shapes, "bubbles" of lead, if you will. That's the same way bullets got their name, through the French *boule*, "ball," used at first to talk about cannonballs. I'm glad the words ended up so similar in English even by taking different paths! But I wonder, are they related to the word for a male bovine...?
