

Oct 23: St. John of <u>Capistrano</u> (1386-1456). This married mayor of Perugia, while imprisoned

during civil war, was overwhelmed by a vision of St. Francis. John got out of jail, dismissed his wife and became a ferocious Franciscan – thanks to the inspiration of Saints Colette and Bernardino. He became the inquisitor for Bohemia


