#### <u>St. Irenaeus de</u> <u>Lyons</u> Pray for us!

June 24: Birth of St. John the Baptist (30+). St. John the Baptist would later say, "I must decrease that he might increase." St. Augustine notes that it is fitting to celebrate the Baptist's birth on this day, since, after the birthday of John, the days grow shorter, after the birth of Jesus, the days get longer.

#### June 25: St. Prosper

**d'Aquitaine** (465+) is the hero of the grace controversy – standing with Augustine over and against the Semi-Pelagians. He is the patron of theologians who are not bishops or priests. He died in Rome as the secretary to Pope Leo the Great.

#### June 26: SS. John and Paul

(362+) were brother martyrs whose relics were deposited on the Coelian Hill in Rome since the 4th century. Some of the frescoes at this church date back to the 2nd century!

# Saints Alive!

We recite their names in the first canon of the Mass. <u>St José María Escribá</u> (1902 -1975) had a divine vision in 1928 concerning the founding of "Opus Dei", or "the Work." This (primarily) lay movement was finally approved in 1983 as a personal prelature of the Holy See.

#### June 27: St. Cyril of Alexandria (376-

444). Cyril championed the title of Mary as Teotokos, "Mother of God" or "Godbearer" in order to highlight the reality of the Incarnation. As Patriarch of Alexandria, he drove out all who disagreed with him spiritually: orthodoxy at all costs started in 412.

June 28: St. Irenaeus de Lyons (125-202) grew up in Smyrna, was greatly influenced by St. Polycarp, then moved to Lyons in Gaul, with many other Greek merchants, and became bishop of this thriving community. He fought Gnosticism in all forms and called for their "stripping of the fox".

#### June 29: SS Peter and Paul

(64+). Earliest representations show Peter as sturdy and thickset, with a curly beard, and Paul as thin and bald, with a long head, scanty beard and deep-set eyes. Could it be a living memory?

#### June 30: Martyrs of

Rome under Nero (64-68+) only since 1969 has this feast been moved to the day after SS Peter and Paul - as we remember July 19th of 64, and the fires that broke out in Rome. The fire raged for 7 days and nights: 2/3rds of Rome was destroyed. Christians were martyred and singled-out as the scapegoats in Nero's palace gardens for the amusement of the nightly crowds. Nero committed suicide four years later.
