<u>December 16: St. Adelaide</u> <u>of Burgundy</u> (931-999).

Shout out to married women saints who have five kids and put up with husbands who put work in first place; she is buried near Strasbourg, oh, did I mention that her husband was the Emperor Otto the Great?

December 17: St Jean de Matha (1213) a French priest from Aix was inspired at his first Mass to dedicate his life to ransoming the Christin slaves from the Muslims in Morocco, Tunisia and Spain. We honor the high school named for him in Hyattsville (Go Greg DeStefano!) His primary relics were moved to Madrid.

<u>St. Zosimus</u> (107) thrown to the lions in Rome – they get a shout out from St. Ignatius of Antioch and St. Polycarp!!

Saints Alive!

December 19: Bd. Urban V (1310-1370). A French priest from Languedoc and trained in Toulouse, Paris and Avignon who became pope. He listened to Petrarch and St. Bridget of Sweden, who encouraged him to move to Rome. He is the sainted pope of sorrow, suffering and deep emotion as he wept over the state of the Church in Avignon and Rome.

December 20: St. Ammon and companions (250). Shout out to Deacon Ammon Ripple on his patronal nameday! He was a brave soldier who declared himself a Christian and was martyred with those he was sent to guard in Alexandria Egypt.

St. Domingo de Silos

(1073). This St. Domingo appeared to Bd. Joan of Aza in a vision at the end of her pilgrimage – and told her that she will have a son, henceforth to be named the other St. Dominic, who would change the world.

December 21 St. Peter Canisius (1521-1597). The 'second apostle to Germany' and the Catholic revival (Counter Reformation) largely come from this Jesuit's work. All it took was one Ignatian retreat and he was in. He moved finally to Fribourg in Switzerland and keeps the city Catholic to this day.

- * Consult our office for specific memorial rules and regulations in the cemetery.


