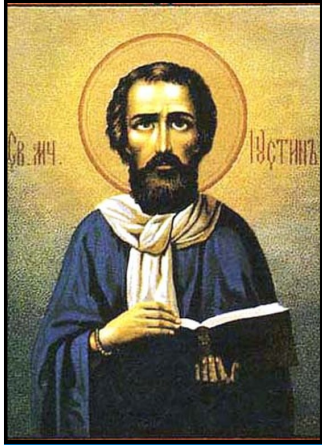

Pray for us!

**Ecclesiastes 3:1-2, 8**

For everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted. A time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.



**May 27: St. Julius the Veteran** (304+). What a great saint for Memorial Day weekend! His story – written from the viewpoint of a devout soldier – describes his service of 27 years with an excellent military record. He refused to sacrifice to the Roman gods and was executed at Silistria, Bulgaria.

**May 28: Bd. Margaret Pole** (1473-1541). Henry VIII (who called her the saintliest woman in England) gave her in marriage to Sir Reginald Pole. She expressed her disapproval of Henry’s marriage to Ann Boleyn. She was poorly executed by a novice in the square in London this day.

**May 29: Bd. Ursula Ledochowska** (1865-1939) is an Ursuline nun in Cracow who evangelized Russia and Scandinavia between the Wars and founded a religious

order for this purpose.

**May 30: St. Joan of Arc** (1412-1431). I love her openness to mysticism and even more so her mother’s courage in appealing to the Holy See twenty years after her daughter’s death. Successfully, Joan was exonerated then beatified and canonized by 1920.

**St. Ferdinand of Castile** (1199-1252) was a king who battled for 27 years to free one-third of Spain from the Moors. I asked his prayers in the cathedral of Burgos which he restored.

**May 31: Visitation!** Mary and Elizabeth are so keenly aware of the savior and prophet that grow in their respective wombs; meditate on the embrace and the spirit-led prophecy between these two glorious women.

**June 1: St. Justin Martyr** (100-165). Oh yes. The man. He was a Greek from Samaria (Shechem) who travelled as a visiting philosopher from Ephesus to

Alexandria. In Ephesus, an old, respectable, meek man spoke to him about the Christ and “my spirit was immediately set on fire, and affection for the friends of Christ took hold of me.” He was executed in Rome by Marcus Aurelius with 6 others. Again, I love authentic witnesses who on their tabula rasa wrote the account of his martyrdom.

**June 2: The Martyrs of Lyons** (177+). Oh yes. Again, authentic eyewitnesses record the ghastly execution of these martyrs: Sanctus, Blandina, Maturus, Attalus. The dungeon and amphitheater where they suffered and died can still be visited in Lyons, France.

- \* Consult our office for specific memorial rules and regulations in the cemetery.

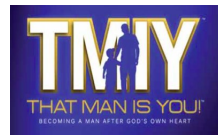
