

St. Ferdinand of Castile (1199-1252) was a king who battled for 27 years to free one-third of Spain from the Moors. I asked his prayers in the cathedral of Burgos which he restored.

May 31: Visitation! Mary and Elizabeth are so keenly aware of the savior and prophet that grow in their respective wombs; meditate on the embrace and the spirit-led prophecy between these two glorious women.

June 1: St. Justin Martyr (100-165). Oh yes. The man. He was a Greek from Samaria (Shechem) who travelled as a visiting philosopher from Ephesus to

Alexandria. In Ephesus, an old, respectable, meek man spoke to him about the Christ and "my spirit was immediately set on fire, and affection for the friends of Christ took hold of me." He was executed in Rome by Marcus Aurelius with 6 others. Again, I love authentic witnesses who on their tabula rasa wrote the account of his martyrdom.

June 2: The Martyrs of Lyons (177+). Oh yes. Again, authentic eyewitnesses record the ghastly execution of these martyrs: Sanctus, Blandina, Maturus, Attalus. The dungeon and amphitheater where they suffered and died can still be visited in Lyons, France.


