

# Saints Alive!

January 7: St. Raymund of Peñafort (1175-1275) this Catalan nobleman bumped into St. Dominic while studying in Bologna and the rest is history. His encyclopedic mind synthesized all canon law. His writings brought about the conversion of so many Jews and Muslims that even St. Thomas Aquinas asked for his help. He died at the age of 99 in Barcelona.

January 8: St. Lorenzo Giustiniani (1381-1455) This Venetian Archbishop has the best mystical writings, personal poverty as well as a great portrait done by Bellini. One day in Venice, I'll pray at his relic shrine.

January 10: St. Gregory of Nyssa (330-395) Baby brother of St. Basil, this holy bishop was falsely accused with embezzling Church funds, escaping from jail and living as a fugitive from the law. He hated pilgrimages! (He had a bad experience during one in Jerusalem) However, his theology of the Holy Spirit is unsurpassed.

#### <u>January 11: St. Theodosius</u> the <u>Cenobiarch</u> (423-529)

I'll call him the patron saint of longevity (he is well documented to have lived to be 105) He left Cappadocia for Bethlehem and is buried in the cave of the Magi.

January 12: St. Aelred of Rievaulx (1110-1167) friend of St. David of Scotland, this holy abbot is the patron saint of brotherly love: as a holy abbot, he supervised 650 men in the largest monastery in England.

**Epiphany is a Christian feast** day that celebrates the revelation of God in His Son as human in Jesus Christ. The word *epiphany* comes from the **Greek word meaning** "manifestation." The feast commemorates the visit of the Magi to the Christ child, and thus Jesus' physical manifestation to the Gentiles. **Typically celebrated on January** 6, or the closest Sunday to that date, the feast of Epiphany allows us to truly comprehend what it means that God has brought His only Son into our world. The Wise Men - Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar – were the first people outside of the stable to come and pay homage to Jesus. These unlikely royal visitors showered Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, herbs typically used for burial, possibly foreshadowing Jesus' destiny.


