

September 2: St. Agricol d'Avignon (630-700) was a great bishop "in charge" of good weather. I dated a gal back in '78 whose father grew flowers on the banks of the Rhône, and when storms arrived, we approached the relic skull of St. Agricol in prayer.

But wait, what about **Bd. Jacques-Louis Schmid**(1752-1792). He was one of 71 priests butchered on this day during the French Revolution at St-Firmin. I like his last name!

September 3: St. Gregory the Great (540-604). Pray that we get other popes like this guy. I pray at his tomb at the Vatican and at his family mansion on the Coelian Hill when in Rome. Nobody writes like him – I like his style better than that of Augustine. His letters are so warm and intelligible.

Saints Alive!

September 4: St. Rosalia of Sicily

(1166) is the principal patron saint of Palermo who, as a solitary cave dwelling hermit, has a knack for showing up and healing the distraught.

September 6: Bd. Bertrand de Garrigues (1230) beloved and trusted travelling companion of St. Dominic from Toulouse, Paris, Bologna, Rome.

September 7: Bd Giovanni Battista Mazzucconi (1826-1855) was a martyr in Woodlark Island off of Papua New Guinea after only 3 years of missionary work on Rooke Island. September 8: St. Tomas de Villanova (1486-1555) is called the model of bishops and the father of the poor. The Augustinians named their flagship university after him outside of Philly.

Bd. Frédéric Ozanam

(1813-1853). He was beatified when I was at World Youth Day in Paris in 1997; I was struck by this professor's love for his wife and daughter, the poor, Western literature, linguistics, politics and his open-door policy for his students. Oh, and in his spare time, he founded the St. Vincent de Paul Society! Check out his relic shrine at St. Joseph des Carmes, Paris.
